












Welcome to the OYIS community



Campus Facilities

OYIS has two campuses in the city: the Nakatsu Campus which houses Preschool to Grade 8, and the Tosabori Campus which is home to Grades 9 to 12.



Nakatsu Campus

Our students from ages 3-14 spend some or all of their time at our original home in Nakatsu, a 10-minute walk from Osaka's largest transportation hub, Umeda. Repurposed from a traditional Japanese elementary school, the Nakatsu Campus is home to students from Early-Childhood to Grade 8.

Facilities include:

- Comfortable classrooms for every grade
- A stand-alone Early Childhood Center
- Specialist areas for Science, Music, and Art
- A large outdoor playground space
- Gymnasium & rooftop swimming pool
- Fully equipped music, science, and art classrooms

Tosabori Campus

Located in the Osaka YMCA Headquarters building just south of Nakanoshima, the Tosabori Campus is home to the upper MYP & DP cohorts. This modern and purpose-built campus opened its doors in August 2020 and dedicates its space to supporting and fostering our secondary students as they pursue their studies.

- State-of-the-art science & design labs
- Spacious learning areas
- Library with a range of books from around the world
- Fully-equipped music studio
- Robotics workspace
- Auditorium

PYP Units of Inquiry

Each Unit of Inquiry runs for approximately 8 weeks and follows four stages:

Wonder → Discover → Create → Express

Students engage with an exciting range of inquiries:

- Who We Are (Self; Beliefs; Values; Relationships)
- Where We are in Place and Time (Change)
- How We Express Ourselves (Play; Imagination; Creativity)
 How the World Works (Materials; Energy; Patterns; Living
- How We Organize Ourselves (Communities; Spaces)

Play Phonics

Our unique Play Phonics approach introduces children to the world of letters and sounds in a joyful, active way. Through songs, games, storytelling, and hands-on activities, children naturally develop early literacy skills while building a lifelong love for language.

Play Maths

In Play Maths, children engage with numbers, patterns, and problem-solving through playful exploration. Using loose parts, games, and real-world experiences, children develop mathematical thinking in ways that are meaningful, creative, and fun.

Making Learning Visible

Through learning stories, portfolios, and child-led conferences, families are invited to engage in the learning journey, seeing growth, inquiry, and creativity unfold firsthand.

Together, these approaches create a joyful and meaningful foundation for learning—where curiosity is celebrated, confidence grows, and every child's journey is made visible.

Where Play Inspires Lifelong Learning

At OYIS, we believe all children are competent, capable, and full of potential. Our Early Childhood Program nurtures the whole child, celebrating each child's unique potential through a play-responsive, inquiry-based curriculum. We place children at the center of learning, fostering curiosity, creativity, a strong sense of belonging, and a lifelong love of discovery.

Our Approach

- Play-Responsive Learning: Children explore, wonder, create, and express through free, guided, and structured play.

Where Inquiry Leads to Empowered Learning

At OYIS, we believe that every child is capable of remarkable growth when given the right nurturing conditions. Our Primary Years Program (PYP) builds on children's natural curiosity, fostering a love of learning, critical thinking, and international-mindedness. Grounded in the IB philosophy, our program develops knowledgeable, caring, and principled learners ready to thrive in a dynamic world.

Our Approach

- Inquiry-Driven Learning: Students engage in authentic, meaningful inquiries across subjects, building deep understanding and transferable skills.
- Transdisciplinary Curriculum: Through the IB Primary Years Programme framework, learning connects across languages, mathematics, the arts, sciences, and social studies.
- Agency: Students are empowered to take ownership of their learning, developing independence, resilience, and a growth mindset.
- Global Citizenship: With a strong emphasis on international-mindedness, students explore diverse cultures, perspectives, and issues, preparing them to be caring contributors to an international community.

PYP Units of Inquiry

Each Unit of Inquiry runs for approximately 6 weeks and follows six stages:

Engage → Focus → Investigate → Organise → Generalise → Transfer

Students engage with an exciting range of inquiries through transdisciplinary themes:

- Who We Are
- Where We are in Place and Time
- How We Express Ourselves
- How the World Works
- · How We Organize Ourselves
- Sharing the Planet



English

Our English program is structured through the internationally respected Readers and Writers Workshop model, supporting students to develop their voice through authentic reading, writing, and critical thinking skills.

Mathematics

Our Mathematics program has been developed through the innovative Concept-Based Inquiry Maths Project, supporting students to explore and identify relationships and patterns to foster deep understandings of mathematical concepts and problem-solving skills.

Making Learning Visible

Learning is celebrated through portfolios, exhibitions, student-led conferences, and authentic assessments. Families are invited to be active partners, engaging with children's learning journeys at every stage.

Middle Years Programme



The Middle Years Programme (MYP) at OYIS is a transformative educational framework that caters to the unique needs of students aged 11 to 16. As part of the International Baccalaureate (IB), the MYP offers a holistic and inquiry-based learning experience, empowering students to become knowledgeable, open-minded, and principled individuals.

The MYP follows a challenging and well-rounded curriculum, encouraging students to explore various disciplines and develop an understanding of global issues. The programme is structured around eight subject groups: Language and Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, Arts, Physical and Health Education, and Design. This approach fosters critical thinking and enables students to make meaningful connections between subjects.

The MYP places great emphasis on developing essential life skills, such as collaboration, and intercultural awareness, preparing students to thrive in an increasingly interconnected world. MYP students complete a Personal Project, which helps them develop research, communication and time-management skills. They also go on overnight trips that help them experience real-world applications of their studies. Through service-learning projects and community engagement, students are encouraged to become caring and responsible global citizens.



Approaches to Learning (ATLs)

Approaches to learning (ATL) are skills designed to enable students in the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP) to "learn how to learn." They are intended to apply across curriculum requirements and provide a common language for teachers and students to use when reflecting and building on the process of learning. IB World Schools are required to ensure there is an ATL planning chart for all years of the MYP. However, broader implementation would see ATLs implicitly and explicitly embedded into day-to-day learning experiences, so that students have opportunities to practice and incrementally develop a range of ATL skills.



Service as action is a foundational element of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP). It seeks to develop caring members of the community who act to make a positive difference to the lives of others and their environment. Service as action requires students to engage with their local community through community or personal projects and provides opportunities for students to explore, design, implement, and reflect on their efforts to positively impact their local environment. Through service as action experiences, students learn the value of community participation and gain a deeper understanding of the issues facing their immediate surroundings.



In the MYP, interdisciplinary learning is the process by which students come to understand bodies of knowledge and modes of thinking from two or more disciplines and then integrate them to create a new understanding. Students demonstrate this by bringing together concepts, methods or forms of communication to explain a phenomenon, solve a problem, create a product or raise a new question in ways that would have been unlikely through a single discipline. Students must be engaged in at least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit in each year of the MYP in order to integrate knowledge and skills from two or more subject groups in an interdisciplinary manner.

Curriculum and Grading in the DP

The DP is structured to provide students with a rigorous and balanced education, to facilitate geographic and cultural mobility, and to promote international understanding and awareness. Courses are examined externally in May of Grade 12, but all have an internally assessed component that is also moderated.

Graduation Requirements

To graduate with an IB Diploma, students must meet all external requirements set by the International Baccalaureate. These include a minimum score of 24 in six subjects, as well as successful completion of **Theory of Knowledge** (ToK), **Extended Essay** (EE), and **Creativity, Activity, Service** (CAS) components.

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP) at OYIS offers an exceptional and intellectually stimulating educational journey for students aged 16 to 19. It is the world's largest and most-respected pre-university course. The DP provides a rigorous and comprehensive curriculum, preparing students for higher education and empowering them to become principled, knowledgeable, and globally-minded individuals.

The DP curriculum is designed to encourage academic excellence and personal development. Students engage in six subject groups: Language and Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, and The Arts. Additionally, the DP Core enriches the programme with three components: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS), and the Extended Essay (EE), allowing students to delve deeper into critical thinking, research, and experiential learning.

The DP emphasises critical inquiry, research, and self-directed learning, fostering an environment where students are encouraged to think independently and reflect on their own perspectives and assumptions. Through collaborative projects and service activities, students develop a sense of social responsibility and a commitment to making a positive impact on their communities and the world.

Extracurriculars at OYIS

OYIS is home to a wide variety of student clubs, teams, and organizations. Family Involvement



We believe that strong family engagement is essential to every child's success. Each year, we host a range of workshops designed to help families better understand their child's learning journey and discover ways to support education both at home and on campus. From casual coffee mornings to live online sessions, parents and caregivers are invited to connect, learn, and share. Topics range from curriculum implementation and technology use, to transitions between programs and college preparation. Every session is recorded and made available for future reference, ensuring families never miss an opportunity to be involved.

The Parent/Caregiver Volunteer Group (PVG) is another vibrant way families can engage with our school community. The PVG fosters goodwill and cooperation by supporting educational and extracurricular activities, helping raise funds for student-led initiatives, and creating opportunities for meaningful connections between families, students, and staff. Together with workshops, the PVG reflects our school's open invitation for families and the wider community to actively participate in and enrich the life of OYIS.

Admissions Information

Once you submit your application to Osaka YMCA International School, the Admissions' Officer will review your information and contact you to set up entrance exams and Principal interviews.

If your child passes the exam and interview stages, a second review is conducted by the Principal and programme coordinators. Should you apply in the middle of the school year, your child may be invited for an in-class observation period.

When all stages are successfully completed, your child will be admitted to OYIS. Registration and tuition fees will be invoiced to you and your child will be officially enrolled once payment is completed.



School Memberships

Osaka YMCA International School is authorised by the International Baccalaureate for the Primary Years Programme (PYP), the Middle Years Programme (MYP), and the Diploma Programme (DP). OYIS is also accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Schools, WASC (Western Association for Schools and Colleges).

ACS WASC accreditation is an ongoing cycle of quality assurance whereby schools demonstrate the capacity, commitment, and competence to support high-quality student learning and ongoing school improvement.
